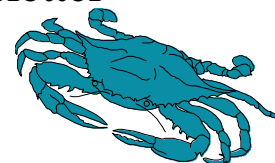

Well, now that I attended some sessions geared towards software developers. I have a few bits of info to report. CA-Visual Objects 2.5 will be released shortly, after some problems with CD creation like missing files and Registration issues. The trial version can be downloaded from :

I saw little mention of OLE DB nor ADO. It seems VO is still a step behind Visual Basic.

Jasmine TND looks to be a viable web developer solution with its OO database and GUI tools. It looks to be a much better product this year.

Computer Associates World Report

CA-World opened for me on July 16th, but for the rest of the world on July 19th. Computer Associates CEO, Charles Wang, made an interesting entrance on a motorbike, making a jump over his COO Sanjay Kumar. Charles Wang spoke of many new things to be seen at CA-World 99. He spoke of Nurbs, Nugents, Visualization and Infrastructure. Charles Wang showed some funny future commercials about Nugents.

Nugents are software agents or components that to learn utilizing neural networks. Nugents are supposed to help businesses "predict the future." Well, anyway, the commercials all show some sports theme where, at the last second, the opponent rudely and physically interrupts the player; then the punch line reads something about Nugents predicting the future.

Wang spoke of the Unicenter TND real world interface and showed a new cool hyperbolic view that administrators can use to easily move through objects on a network. They showed a new upstart company, that is at a site metastream.com, that partnered with CA to create a cool future site for home decorating. Basically, someone can take some digital pictures of a room in a house. Send the pics to MetaCreations and MetaCreations will render the room and allow it to be accessed online. The furniture can be arranged and replaced with furniture for sale from their site. Now I haven't gone to the site yet, so this may be just smoke and mirrors.

Wang spoke about Quokka, a cool sports internet site, and a few new company upstarts.

One impressive future view was one Office Depot is working on. Imagine having agents (Nugents) running on your network that monitor laser printer usage. After a cer-



tain period of printing, the Nugent figures that the toner will be low. Before the printer actually tells the user it is low, the Nugent signals an order to be made to Office Depot. Office Depot gets the order, fills the order and ships. The Toner cartridge arrives just in time when the laser printer warns the user. I like it. Think of all the middle men who can order more important things than toner cartridges.

Lastly, Wang spoke about the SmileTrain and National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. CA sponsors the Center and in the past two years have helped develop a really good website. Charles told of a few stats, I don't remember the exact numbers, but here goes. The website helped solve more cases in the past few years with the aid of the website than the center has resolved over its past 15 year life. The website opened about 5200 cases in '97 and resolved 4800 or so. In '98 the website opened about 5400 cases and resolved 5800. CA helped develop the website and the technology to help in the incredible process of predicting a child's looks over time. CA showed an example of a boy's picture at age 2 and how the computer predicted he would

look when he was 5 years older. After the case was closed, the child's photo looked incredibly like that predicted view. Wang has asked all webmasters to donate a small piece of real estate to the Center, so without further objection, I will do just that.

The World Resource Center has hundreds of software vendors and a 1/4 mile go-cart race track. The theme of this year's conference was "The Fun of Software."

If anyone is interested, I have a CD of all presentations at the conference. I will probably go over a few at future Windows Application Developers SIG meetings on Monday nights at McCann Electronics.

Book Review

This is a review of *Taming the Internet*, a book by a local author **Charlyn Keating**, who is actively involved with Internet education in various forms. The publisher is Prytania Press and the ISBN is 1-893328-25-2. The book lists for \$14.95.

This is a book for novices, not experienced users. I'm an ISP (Internet Service Provider), so I have some idea what sort of questions Internet newbies have. The author does a very good job of introducing the Internet to first time users. She concentrates on how to use the Internet without getting bogged down in the details of why things work. She also includes tips on New Orleans specific Internet sites and options.

Now for some details. The book starts off by talking about how to get connected to the Internet. It discusses hardware, software and ISP selection. Included are some New Orleans options like the public library system and gnofn.org. There is also a list of both local and national ISPs in one of the appendixes.

Next is a primer on using a web browser. The author then covers search engines, email (spam, attachments, mailing lists), downloading files, and setting up your own web site. Throughout the text there are links to useful web sites where you can get more information.

I was pleased to see a section on security. This is an important topic. It need to be understood, not ignored or feared. The author covers use of credit cards, privacy issues, viruses, and use by children.

The book winds up with a list of good web sites to visit. It lists about 40 sites, spending a full page describing each one. This is followed by an informative glossary which covers common Internet terms in non-technical language.

Overall the book presents a good balance between "what to do" and "how to do it", much like a good tour guide. Considering the attractive price, I highly recommend this book to new Internet users.
